David Leggott of Quinton Green has passed away aged 73.

David was born in Owston Ferry, Lincolnshire in 1949, to Albert and Stella Leggott, he would become the eldest of 3 boys.

He started life on the canals, transporting stone up and down the river Aire, Ouse and Trent – the family trade. He attended school in Owston Ferry before moving on to begin a farming college course in Selby.



David moved to Turney's farm from Selby aged 20 for a one-year placement as part of his farming college education. However, one year turned into 53 years, since David loved life so much in Quinton, he decided to make it his home.

David met Joan in 1974 and were married soon after in 1975. They had two daughters, Debbie and Rebecca, five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
