7. A Quinton Farmer's Diary - Spring 2023

Thank you to Giles for offering to do a quarterly update about the fields around us – I found his first entry below really interesting, as I'm sure many other people will do (I have to confess that I've lived here nearly 40 years and didn't know the names of the fields!)

Many people walk from Quinton towards Preston Deanery either along the road or on the permissive right of way and I get many questions about what is growing in the fields. In order to keep you up to date I plan to write a quarterly update which I hope you will find interesting.

The first field on the left as you leave Quinton is called Lower Farm Field and has a total area of 72 hectares. The first field to the right is called Village Field with a total area of 38 hectares. The next field along on the right is Watt Field with an area of 16 hectares.

Lower Farm Field has got 3 hectares of wild bird seed mix in it at the northerly end of the field adjacent to the Wootton Brook which is established in May each year and it provides a mixture of seeds for the bird population throughout the following winter. Lower Farm Field also has a 6-metre-wide grass margin bordering the watercourses, this is in place to protect the watercourses and provides a wildlife corridor around the edge of the field. Both of these features are part of the Government's Countryside Stewardship Scheme and accordingly must not be walked on by the public.

Village Field has 3 hectares of grass and wild flower mix running along the back of the Village. This is also part of the Countryside Stewardship Scheme but was mainly put in to reduce surface water run-off going into the Village. This seems to be achieving its aim as water run-off has been reduced.

Watt Field has got the public footpath running diagonally across it towards the Rookery Woods which many people use. The field has an area of wild bird seed mix near to Park Farm and a grass margin which borders the brook. Each year we change the mix of seed-bearing plants in a similar way to crop rotation. This year's mix which we will establish in May includes sunflowers, spring triticale, spring barley, white millet, linseed, kale and fodder radish. Please don't pick the sunflowers even though they look attractive because you will be stealing wild bird food sources which they so desperately need.

All three fields have crops of Crusoe winter wheat in them which is a milling wheat variety and will ultimately be harvested and sent directly to our farmer co-operative store at Kettering where it will be dried, blended

and stored with other farmer members milling wheat. The vast majority of it will be sent to Rank Hovis flour mill at Finedon where flour will be produced to supply the Hovis bakeries.

At this time of the year the crops are waking up from the winter dormant period and we are starting to apply nitrogen fertiliser which the crop needs to aid growth. Each week I receive updated satellite imagery showing me the amount of crop growth and I can tailor the nitrogen application according to the crop canopy. This ensures that the correct amount of nitrogen is targeted to each part of the field. We call this variable rate application.

We have many rights of way across our land and take pride in marking and maintaining them so that they are as accessible as possible. We hope that you enjoy using them. If you are unsure as the where the rights of way are please refer to the West Northants Interactive Map <u>https://maps.southnorthants.gov.uk/wml_public/Map.aspx?mapName=</u> <u>WNC_Map</u>. Please do keep your dogs under control and on the right of way at all times.

In the coming months the fields will change as the crops grow and we will be establishing spring oats on some parts of the farm and also sowing next year's wild bird seed mix in various locations around the farm to benefit the bird population next winter.
