12. 4. 1926 - Olive Maud Lodge admitted age 7 yrs. a child from Dr. Barnardo's Home.  
 (8. 5. 1926) - Rev<sup>o</sup> Polwhele buried at Quinton.  
 J. D. Kaine MacLellan still signed registers
4. 12. 1925 - last entry by Rev Polwhele in a shaky hand
17. 6. 1925 - Half holiday granted so for the children to take part in Pageant (Missionary)  
 "Pontius Call" at Roads.
8. 12. 1926 - The school was closed this afternoon as a meeting was held with regard to the fusion of the parish with Pockon Deanery.
15. 2. 1927 - Mrs Forbes came to school this morning and bestowed for the R.S.P.A.
5. 5. 1927 - The register was marked at 1 pm instead of 1.30 pm in order that the school might attend the Service in Quinton Church for the Induction of the Rev<sup>o</sup> G. Stewart M.A.  
 The children were eager to do this & all were here at one o'clock - with the exception that Mrs Mrs Godley and Mr & Mrs Tyson refused to let their children leave dinner early and kept them at home for the afternoon.
26. 5. 27 - Ascension Day - Rev Stewart took 1/2 hour service with the children
7. 7. 27. - Only two children arrived - very bad weather - I informed the Correspondent manager & asked permission to send these two children home that I might attend the Ceremony and see The Prince of Wales in Northampton. This was granted
11. 7. 27 Eric Armas Sutton admitted, 10 yrs, a child from Dr. Barnardo's.
4. 10. 27 J. D. Kaine MacLellan and his daughter, Mrs Brooks visited
19. 3. 28 Selma Mary Sutton, 7 yrs Dr. Barnardo's.
22. 6. 28 As Mrs Sharp was ill, I took Sidney Sharp to Harding Place School for Dental treatment. I left Miss Borchwell in charge (a lady teacher visiting the Rectory, (Teacher E. H. Watters).
1. 11. 1928 Division Report - The children respond & it shows in their pleasure in singing which is sweet toned and well enunciated, & by their good knowledge of the Old & New Testament & their lesson on the Prayer Book
17. 5. 1929 Parents were invited & suitable programme arranged for Empire Day.
29. 7. 1929 Eitel Darby met with an accident (knocked down in Northampton by motor car) & died in hospital - Friday evening last.

27. 7. 29 Arthur Gauthropp visited school

(Coke and coal regularly received through auction/writer all year.)

17. 11. 32 Changed morning (with Pockon permission) and afternoon timetable to enable us to go to Blisworth to see the arrival of the Duke & Duchess of York there.

18. 1. 33 This morning the school was full of smoke and fumes from the stove which is worn out. I have repeatedly asked for another and last Thursday was told it was being upset in class. I could not clear the school so \*phoned the office for instructions and was told to send the children home & try to have school this afternoon. I did so.

9. 3. 33 Mallard came in morning & repaired two windows which had been broken - also fixed the slates which had been blown off in the gale.

29. 3. 33 Received clock for school in good order.

24. 5. 33 Empire Day Celebration - Talk on Empire in morning 11.30-12. - Grand March - Salute Flag - Patriotic Songs - God Save the King 1.15-1.30p.

25. 5. 33 Ascension Day - Service in Church at 9.00am. School dismissed at 10.00am.

2. 6. 33 I terminate my duties (Ida Harpe) Break up school at 12.00pm

As I have a long journey today & am moving my furniture, the Pockon has given me permission to close school as soon as the men have finished packing.

13.7.32 - School closed at 3.25pm to enable teachers to catch 3.30pm bus.

12.6.33 - 2, Edith Palmer, County Council Emergency Staff arrived this morning to take temporary charge of this school. I was met by the Rector, Mrs Tyson, and handed the keys and needlework sales money together with a letter from the late headmistress.

11.9.33 2 - Edith Mary Pidmore commenced duties as Headmistress this morning.

15.1.34. SAO visited - I requested that he visits the employers and Parents of Arthur Richardson (aged 17) who works here each evening at the rate of 1<sup>st</sup> per hour.
