Mervyn Maule was the much-loved brother to Cynthia, John and uncle to Tina, Stephen & Trudi. He was born at West Hall Quinton Green in

1952 and moved to Quinton village when he was only one year old.

He then lived at number 4 Preston Deanery Road until he met and married his wife Chris when he moved to Cirencester before finally coming to rest in Worle Weston-super Mare.

His school days were spent first at Wootton Primary school and then at Roade Secondary Modern. Upon leaving education behind he became a digger driver for JCB until he decided he wanted a change and became a full-time gardener in the village.



While he lived in Quinton, he was a big part of our community. He helped to set up the Produce show and took part entering many items especially his famous very large onions.
