# 8. Quinton Farmer's Diary - Autumn 2023

Since writing the summer diary entry a lot has happened on the farm. The crops turned to golden brown, they were then harvested and some of next year's crops have been established.

The weather this August was a total contrast to last year's very dry harvest with constant rain showers which only allowed harvesting for short periods of time. Most of the crops that we have cut have had to be dried at considerable expense. This has to be done to allow them to be stored safely without deteriorating.

All of our wheat from Quinton has left the farm and is being stored at our farmers' co-operative store Camgrain at Kettering. It all made milling quality and over the winter months will be delivered into the Hovis mill at Finedon to eventually be turned into bread.

The wheat crop off Lower Farm Field was grown for seed and it passed all of the seed quality tests and has now been processed at a seed plant near Buckingham for drilling into other farmers fields around the country.

The harvest team of Laurence who drives the combine and our two temporary harvest lads from Southern Ireland worked long hours and extremely hard when the weather conditions allowed as it was a very stop-start harvest.

As you will have noticed over the last couple of weeks the fields along both sides of the Preston Deanery Road have rapidly emerging crops of oilseed rape. They were established by Dan with our Fendt crawler and special oil seed rape drill. The drill low disturbance cultivates, sows the seed, injects liquid starter fertiliser and broadcasts slug pellets all in one operation. The seed is applied variably which means the heavier soil type parts of the field have more seed sown into them and the lighter parts of the field have less seed sown into them. This is because the seed will establish easier on the lighter soil types meaning we need more seed on the heavier soils so to ensure a good crop.

This year we have also planted a companion crop of buckwheat and berseem clover with the oilseed rape which has the advantage of attracting beneficial insects into the crop canopy, improves the crop nutrition and fixes nitrogen. The companion crops also improves overall soil health. Both of the companion crops are sensitive to frost and will be killed off when we experience our first frosts in winter leaving the oilseed rape to grow away on its own.

In the middle of October we will start drilling next years' winter wheat crop and by the end of October start drilling our winter bean crops.

The wild birdseed mixtures have performed well this year and have set a lot of seeds for the birds this winter.

The area of grass and wildflower mix to the rear of the Village has recently been mown and baled into hay. We have done this to remove the large amounts of grass which if left would have added to the soil fertility which the wildflowers do not like. Hopefully next year we will have a greater abundance of wild flowers.
