Speeding Enforcement

The Police carried out traffic speed monitoring in late January in the village. They used a portable speed camera and there were no offences committed during the period they were active.

The Police have supplied the following information.

- The camera was positioned on the Quinton Road outside the last house before you leave for Northampton.
- It was a handheld device, not a camera, and it was there for only 30 minutes.
- Local PCSO was the operator of the speed gun, and had a fully marked Police vehicle, and in full uniform.
- Motorists may have been pre-warned by each other, and many modern sat navs even have the ability to log our presence.

Manor Oak Homes

There have been some developments on the planning application submitted by Manor Oak Homes. National Highways have submitted an objection as Manor Oak have not supplied sufficient information for an approval. They have requested a further 3-month delay to any approval.
