11. Quinton Farmers Diary Summer 2024

The weather continues to conspire against us all but at least when the sun shines it brings some warmth.

The oilseed rape alongside the Preston Deanery Road flowered for a good few weeks. During this period they were sprayed once with a fungicide to coat the flowers to prevent sclerotinia disease which affects the stems of the oilseed rape plant and reduces yield. The disease spores lie dormant in the ground but can be triggered by temperature and rainfall. The oilseed rape crop have now finished flowering and the pods are starting to develop and fill out with their seeds. The seeds start green and ripen to black and become hard prior to harvest. The next operation will be desiccation which is spraying the crop off with glyphosate to even up the crop and reduce the moisture of the rape seed.

Elsewhere on the Farm we have been busy applying nitrogen fertiliser to all the wheat crops which have also had four applications of fungicides. With the continuing wet weather and warm temperatures disease levels are high and we have had to spend more money to control the diseases. For example, if you look at the wheat crops, they have brown on the lower leaves in the canopy which is Septoria and if left uncontrolled this would spread to the upper leaves which contribute to the final yield by photosynthesis. The wheat crops have also had disease pressure from yellow and brown rust. The brown rust normally affects the wheat later in the season in late June but this year due to the milder wet winter we have seen it in early March.

We did not manage to establish any bean crops this year due to the continuous waterlogged and poor soil conditions. This land has been left fallow and recently we have drilled a cover crop of buckwheat and phacelia into the ground to put some living roots into the soil so to improve the soil structure.

The spring oat crop was finally drilled in the middle of April (instead of early March) this will have a knock-on effect of lower yield and quality due to the shortened growing season.

I attended the annual cereals event which was held this year in Hertfordshire. Usually this is an upbeat event but this year there were hoards of very disgruntled farmers who seem to have aged considerably in the last year!

Harvest will soon be with us and as usual can I please ask for your understanding during this very busy time of year. Please take care on our local roads as there will be many tractor and trailer movements at all hours. Thank you! (page left blank)
