This site is an enduring memory of the legacy that Fran Piercy left the village. Some sections that you might find particularly interesting are:


- her reminiscences of life in Quinton in the 1940s

Frances passed away at home on the 8th May 2024.

Frances and her family moved to Quinton in 1940 after fleeing their home in Sidcup Greater London during the start of the war.
