Manor Oak Homes

There have been a series of new documents added to the planning portal, the council is responding to these with their objections / comments.

One of the elements of the planning process is for the Parish Council to submit a list of requirements should the development get approved. The council has been considering these and the following is a list of those requests. If you have any comments, please let the Clerk know as soon as possible.

- Provision for additional village car parking spaces adjacent to the Village Green on Preston Deanery Road, facing the Church.
- A plot of land to be set aside on the Manor Oak development site (within the Quinton Parish designated land) for use as a cemetery.
- To update the parish streetlighting to a more cost effective and efficient lighting with additional units to cover the proposed and existing junctions.
- Purchase, installation and running costs for an ANPR camera system to cover four entry points to the village, for clarity a 4-camera system with a running cost contribution for 10 years.
- Erect and include signage for a new village "Gateway" on Washbrook Lane, similar to those already in place on Wootton Road.
- Provision for an improved disabled entrance to the rear of the Village Hall including a lift system, the installation of Solar Panels on the roof of the Village Hall and the installation of a ground source heat pump to secure the long term viability of the facility.
- Purchase an installation of 4 solar powered Vehicle Activated Signs (VAS) on Wootton Road.
- Two pedestrian crossings (Puffin Type) to be installed on Wootton Road.
- A noise reduction system to be installed on Wootton Road for those houses directly affected by the increase in traffic.
