15. 2. 1927 - Mrs Forbes came to school this morning and lectured for the RSPCA.
5. 5. 1927 - The register was marked at 1pm instead of 1.30pm in order that the school might attend the Service in Quinton Church for the Induction of the Revd G Stewart MA.
- The children were eager to do this & all were here at one o'clock - with the exception that Mrs Mrs Godley and Mr & Mrs Tyron refused to let their children leave home early and kept them at home for the afternoon.
26. 5. 27 - Ascension Day - Rev Stewart took ½ hour service with the children.
7. 7. 27 - Only two children arrived - very bad weather - I informed the Correspondent manager & asked permission to send these two children home that 2 might attend the Ceremony and see The Prince of Wales in Northampton. This was granted.
11. 7. 27 Eric Aras Sutton admitted, 10 yrs, a child from Dr. Barnados.
4. 10. 27 J D Keltie MacCullum and his daughter, Miss Brooks visited.

22. 6. 28 As Mr Sharp was ill, I took Sidney Sharp to Hardingside School for dental treatment. I left Miss Bordewill in charge (a lady teacher visiting the Rectory, Teacher E N Watters).
1. 11. 1928 Annual Report 'The children respond & it shows in their pleasure in singing which is sweet toned and well enunciated, & by their good knowledge of the Old & New Testament & their lesson or the Prayer Book.'
17. 5. 1929 Parents were invited & suitable programme arranged for Empire Day.
29. 7. 1929 Edith Darby met with an accident (knocked down in Northampton by motor car) & died in hospital - Friday evening last.

29. 7. 29 Arthur Gauntlett visited school
(Colic and coal regularly received through autumn/winter old year.)
17. 11. 32 Charnel morning (with Rockers permission) and afternoon timetable to enable us to go to Blisworth to see the arrival of the Duke & Duchess of York there.
18. 1. 33 This morning the school was full of smoke and fumes from the stone which is worn out. I have repeatedly asked for another and last Thursday was told it was being put in hand. I could not clear the school to ~~phone~~ the office for instructions and was told to send the children home & try to have school this afternoon. I did so.

29. 3. 33 Received clock for school in good order.
24. 5. 33 Empire Day Celebration - Talk on Empire in morning 11.30-12 - Grand March - Salute Flag - Patriotic Songs - God Save the King 1.15-1.30p -
25. 5. 33 Accession Day - Service in Church at 9.00am. School dismissed at 10.00am.
2. 6. 33 I terminate my duties (Ida Harpe) Break up school at 12 noon.
- As I have a long journey today & am moving my furniture, the Rocker has given me permission to close school as soon as the men have finished packing.
