The minutes of the last meeting held on February, 18th 1958 were read and after Canon Hopkin's apology for non-attendance had been added they were approved and signed.

The Chairman then gave a detailed account, a copy of which was made available for all to see, of the financial position showing details of grants paid and probable grant to come. The Chairman pointed out that the full grant would not be paid unless all the equipment was purchased and proof of such purchase submitted. The meeting agreed not to purchase a piano nor an electric clock but asked Mrs. Raine, Mrs. Rooks and Mrs. Turney to make enquiries regarding a record player. Mrs. Turney agreed to see about ashtrays. The question of large tables was brought up and Mrs. Raine said she hired some from Rev. Husbands at Roade which seemed first class for the job. The Chairman was asked to make enquiries.

The Chairman said that Mr. Gawthrop had expressed the wish that no intoxicants were to be taken into the Hall. Canon Hopkins, whilst agreeing with this, said he was sure Mr. Gawthrop did not mean this to deprive people of intoxicants, for example such as wines for toasts at weddings etc. It was decided to look into this with a view to having a notice put up. There being no further business the meeting closed at 8.15p.m.

The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting held on April 30th 1959 were read and confirmed bringing out of the minutes.

Mr. Ray made a further complaint about the slay spoil in his garden at No. 5, Smeaton Downy.

head and also next door at no. 4. Major Wake said he would look into this question.

School Bus Site. This was again discussed and the Chairman was asked to write again about filling in the ditches etc. The suggestion of picking up the children some 10 minutes earlier before collecting the Bournemouth children was discussed and it was decided to enquire of parents not present in order to get their views. It was also suggested that the original plan of moving the corner should be carried out or as an alternative the school lane corner should be cut back to enable the bus to double back and come through the village. The Chairman was asked to take the necessary actions.

Mr. Fenney asked if it could become the responsibility of the Council to keep the churchyard in order and not for it to be

left in the hands of the few churchgoers. Major Wake said he did not think the Council would accept responsibility for the churchyard as it was not full and closed. The question of sheep grazing from time to time was discussed and the Chairman was asked to look into the cost of fencing etc.

The Chairman asked the meeting to make it known to the elderly people of the village about the Blacton Holiday Scheme run by the County Council and to let him know of anyone wishing to take part.

There were still two people wanting allotments. Major Wake said he would look into this also.

Civil Defence. Mr. Fenney asked if further details of this could be obtained as to what was involved in the way

The question of a bus shelter was brought up and Major Wake said this was the responsibility of the Village and help in the way of plans and suggestions could be obtained from the Rural Community Council. The Chairman pointed out that he felt the Village ought to first settle the financial problems of the Village Hall before thinking about a shelter. To this the meeting agreed.

Mr. Short complained about the ditches in the Village, particularly near Mr. Wilson's gateway and behind the telephone kiosk. The Chairman was asked to write when dealing with the question of piping in the ditches earlier referred to.

There being no further business the meeting terminated at 9 pm.

The minutes of the last Annual Parish Meeting were read and confirmed having out of the minutes:-

The revised estimates for providing electric lighting in the village were given by the chairman and in view of the fact that a capital expense of £41 would be involved as well as a small sum on the rates the meeting decided not to go into the matter any further. Canon Hopkins asked if certain items could be taken out of Agenda order as he wished to leave early for another appointment.

Development of site near old rectory. The Rector explained when old rectory was sold a small parcel of land was retained so that a new rectory could be erected if needed. He pointed out this was never likely to be needed and it was proposed to sell this plot for building. The Rector asked if there were any objections. No one at the meeting objected.

Canon Hopkins asked if he could be included in Quinton Electoral Roll, but it was pointed out to him that he had only one vote which was in his own parish of Wootton.

Concern was shown by several present at the system of picking up and dropping schoolchildren on the main road and also that the younger children had to wait in Wootton some considerable time before the bus comes from Road School.

No one appeared interested in Civil Defense and there were no applications for allotments.

Snow clearance. It was reported that no action had to be taken as there was no snow.

King George's Jubilee Trust. The Social Club and Youth Club offered assistance for Forest Land. Mr. Payne was thanked for his good work.

Social Club. Mr. Toney reported on some financial position. Mr. East wished to retire from the Committee and Mr. Harvey was elected to his place. Major Wake gave an interesting talk on local government which the whole heartedly applauded.

A suggestion that a 30 miles per hour limit ~~was~~ ^{be} imposed on the part of the main road passing the village was discussed and it was decided that Mr. Toney should ask the County Surveyor, Mr. Saunders to meet a small party representing the village on the site to discuss the serious question of the school bus picking up on the main road.

It was proposed, seconded and carried unanimously that Mr. Toney continue as chairman. There was no further business. The meeting ended at 9pm. ^{of the year}

Apologies were received from Isaac Hopkin. Major Wake, Mr. Raine, Mrs. Wilson & Mr. Davidson. The minutes of the last annual parish meeting were read and confirmed.

Moving on to the minutes: The Chairman reported that in company with Mrs. Hardy, Mrs. Harvey, Mrs. Watton and Mr. Richardson

he met Mr. Saunders, the County Surveyor about creating safer facilities for picking up and setting down the schoolchildren. Mr. Saunders agreed to widen the approach to the service road by the council houses so that the bus could manoeuvre in and pick up the children in the morning from this service road. In the evening for setting down the children he proposed an unloading platform on the main road and a culvert over the ditch enabling the children to run over in safe conditions. The arrangement now appeared satisfactory and the Chairman was asked to thank the County Surveyor on behalf of the meeting.

Messrs. Johnson show application to put on a daily bus service through Quinton was considered and it was

the unanimous wish of the considerably representative meeting that support should be given to the scheme. The Chairman was requested to write to the Traffic Commission supporting the application.

Reference was made to the correspondence re: ~~the~~ Snow clearance, Electro's list, Litter Bins, Rateable Value, and Tidest Village competition, but no action was taken.

Forest Land Money. After considering various alternatives to the present distribution it was finally decided to pay the Forest Land Money into a Trust Fund on behalf of Quinton village to be used in any way the annual parish meeting decided.

The Chairman referred to the Village Hall, the schoolhouse and Quinton

church for all of which funds he is treasurer and reported that all were solvent. He mentioned that the schoolhouse was vacant and was being let by Howkins Sons & Co of Northampton.

Mr. Wilson proposed and Mr. Short seconded and it was carried unanimously that Mr. Turney should be chairman for a further year.

Social Club. Mrs. Turney reported a successful year for the social club and asked for volunteers for two more on the committee. It was left for the remaining committee members to recommend the extra persons they need.

Youth Club. Mrs. Howey reported a successful series of meetings of the club the members of which were being encouraged to help run the club.

She pointed out however that she needed help, especially to control the older boys. Mrs. U. Smith kindly offered to help on Friday evenings in the next autumn & winter.

The meeting expressed its appreciation to Mrs. Howey for the good work she had undertaken with the Quinlan Youth Club.

The untidy church yard ~~at~~ and old playground of the Village Hall were discussed. There was a general desire to improve this, but no constructive suggestions were forthcoming.

The meeting wished to place on record their grateful thanks to Mr. Haine for his work in collecting and distributing the Forest Hand Money.

There being no further business the meeting terminated at 8.30 pm.

The minutes of the last Annual Parish meeting were read and confirmed. Arising out of the minutes Mr. Harvey asked if the Chairman could write

to Messrs. Johnson & Son, the local bus proprietors and ask them if they could run an additional daily bus that is in at 2 pm and out at 4 pm. Mr. Turrey brought up the question of tidying up the churchyard and the Chairman stated that several parishioners were good enough to spare men to do this work, but the burden fell on this few. Mr. Harvey suggested a retired man could take on this work.

Old Peoples Holiday. The Chairman asked that old people be approached with a view to joining the Council's Holiday Scheme in 1964.

Village Pound. It was stated that Parfryson the builders were using the Village Pound as a rubbish dump. A suggestion was made that

this be taken in the new house garden.

Public Right of Way, Rectory Field.

The barbed wire blocking this path was temporary and when the new home was occupied this would be put right. The chairman was asked to approach the County Council regarding the erection of style steps at each end of field.

Mr. Hardy complained of the crumbling paths at his home, also fences and exterior painting. Mr. Hightley made similar complaints and about the bad state of the pavements and cracks in walls in house.

Major Wake said he would personally look into these complaints after the meeting.

Forest Land. The chairman said this

was let to Mr. Lamrock @ 1/5 per annum and that £10 was now deposited at the Trustees Savings Bank.

Social Club. Mr. Turvey said the club met at a Whist Dinner every other week and they had taken the old folk out for a day. The meeting expressed thanks for this and extended its appreciation to Mr. E. Cook for his good work and also to Mr. Horvey and Westcott for their work with the Youth Club. Appreciation was also extended to Miss Henry for her efforts with the Guides & Brownies.

Miss Eastwood asked if a stamp machine could be erected in the Village.

Miss Wilson proposed and Mr. Short seconded that Mr. Turvey be chairman

for a further year.

The question of the bus stop was raised and the Chairman was asked to write to the County Council about a pavement near the telephone kiosk as the road was very dirty ~~and~~ in wet weather and not suitable for intending passengers. It was also suggested that this pavement could take a shelter at a later date when the Council was financially able to provide one.

The low sign post was also criticised as being dangerous.

Major Wake apologized for being late and said a few words about local government.
