made a lengthy search for a site for a Village Hut, but it had been in vain. Canon Hopkins had explained why the Ecclesiastical Authorities had not yet been able to put forward a definite proposal concerning the sale and/or letting of the Schoolroom and Land, and he had hoped to have an answer in the very near future. It was therefore decided to postpone any further decision about a Village Hut until the views of the Managers of the School concerning the future use of the School were made known.

② The re-roofing of the Schoolroom: the Chairman reported that this had been carried out, and so far it appeared that a very good job had been done.

The Treasurer then gave his financial report, and after very much discussion it was unanimously agreed that £25 in the Bank Account of the Club should be transferred to the Building Society Investments — this was
