## The Second Composition for the tithes of Quinton

September 28. 1639

The Agreement made with S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Dyves Knight and his lady for the tithes of his grounds in Quinton.

It is fully agreed and concluded betweene S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Dyves Knight, & Dame Howard his wife on the one part, and Jeremy Stephens Clerke, Rector of the Church of Quinton on the other part, That the sayd Jeremy Stephens shall and will accept, for all manner of tithes for the demeane lands of the sayd S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Dyve as well the pastures by what names soever, as the common meadowes, grounds in the feidds of Quinton, the summe of 16£ by the yeare to be payd quarterly: The first payment to beginne and be made at the feast-day of the Maturity of our Lord God next coming.

And in case the sayd S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Dyre shall be minded to break up or plough any of the sayd pastures, then the sayd Mr Stephens doth further agree to accept for all such grounds or so many thereof as shall be ploughed, after the rate of — 4<sup>d</sup> the acre, and to

abate a proportionall rate of the other  
annuall allowances of 16<sup>s</sup> per annum, for  
aforesayd so much as aforesayd (The Acre to be  
measured according to the statute,  
accounting 16 foote & an halfe to the pole.)  
And the sayd S<sup>r</sup> Lewis Dyve and Dame  
Howard his wife do in like manner  
undertake on their part, that the sayd  
Mr. Stephens shall be duly answered and  
payd the rate aforesayd, in manner as  
aforesaid, and that Mr. Stephens shall and  
may enjoy the close called Elsmoore and  
the pightle now in the Tenure of the sayd  
Jeremy Stephens, under and for the rent  
he now payeth for the same viz - 43<sup>d</sup>  
p. annum to be payd halfe yearly.

The Agreement made with Sr Lewis Dyves Knight and his Lady  
for the tithes of his grounds in Quinton.

It is fully agreed and concluded betwene Sr Lewis Dyves  
Knight, & Dame Glloward his wife on the one part, and Jeremy  
Stephens Clarke, Rector of the Church of Quinton on the  
other part, That the sayd Jeremy Stephens shall and  
will accept, for all manner of titheis for the demeane lands of  
the sayd Sr Lewis Dyve as well the pastures by what names  
ever, as the common meadowes, groundes in the fields of  
Quinton, the summe of 16*l* by the yeare to be payed  
quarterly: The first payment to beginne and be made at the  
feast-day of the Nativite of our Lord God next coming:

And in case the sayd Sr Lewis Dyve shall be minded to  
break up or plough any of the sayd pastures, then the sayd  
Mr Stephens doth further agree to accept for all such groundes  
or so many therof as shall be ploughed after the rate of  
4*p* to the acre, and to abate a proportionall rate of the other  
annuell allowances of 16*l* per annum, for so much as aforesaid.

(The Acre to be measured according to the Statute, accounting 16 foot  
& an halfe to the pole.) And the sayd Sr Lewis Dyve and Dame  
Glloward his wife do in like manner undertake on their part, that  
the sayd Mr Stephens shall be duly answered and payd the  
rate aforesaid, in manner as aforesaid, and that Mr Stephens shall  
and may enjoy the close called Elffmoore and the rightle now in  
the tenurie of the sayd Jeremy Stephens, under and for the  
rent he now payeth for the same viz—4*p*. annuum to be  
payd halfe yearly.
